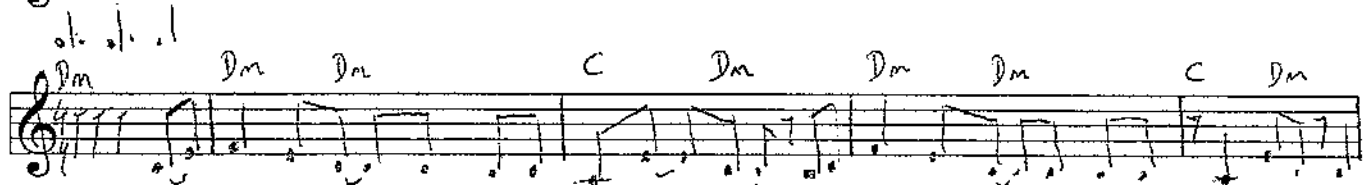
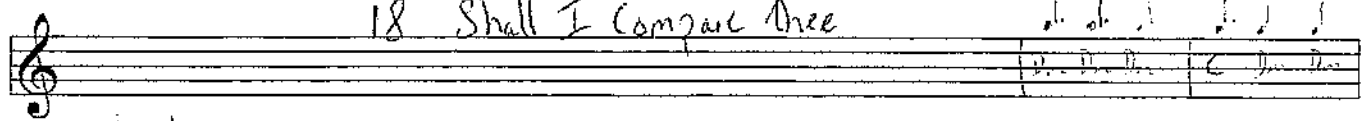

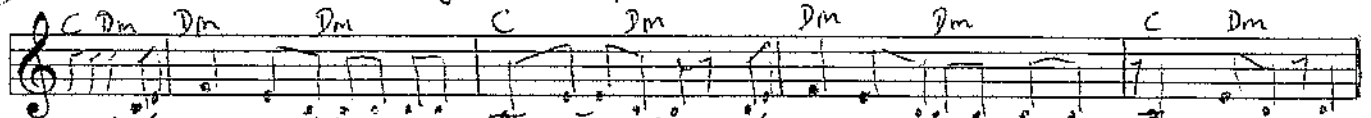

Shall I com-pare thee to a sum-mers day Thou art more love-ly and more tem-perate, though



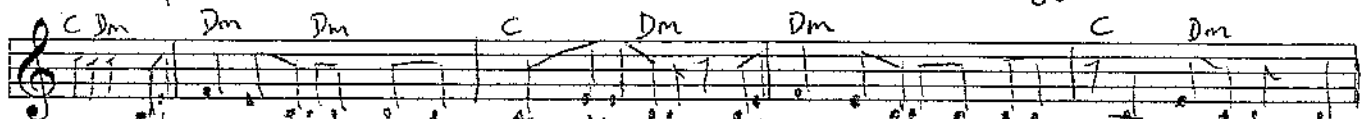

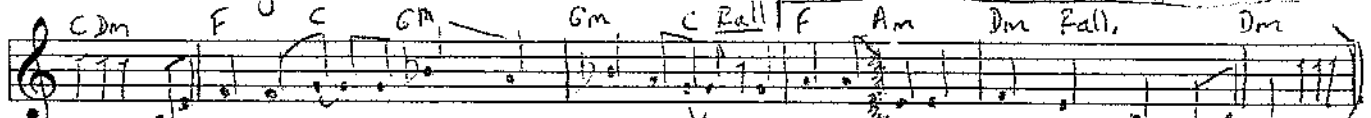

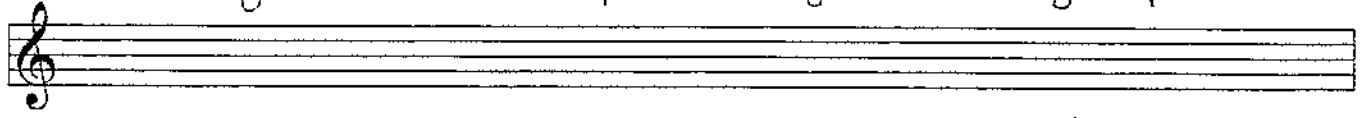
