## **Up In Arms**

A group exhibition curated by Ayşe Güngör, Cassandra Mehlhorn, Gabriela Seith, Amalie Sølling-Jørgensen and Johanna Werner. The exhibition Up In Arms presents activist and artistic contributions opposing the global arms trade. As a starting point it takes John Heartfield (1891 - 1968), whose photomontages turned art into a form of protest against the arms industry. In that spirit, Up In Arms understands art as a form of action capable of inducing change. Some of the artists take an activist stance against the arms industry. Others address local and global aspects from a documentary standpoint, introducing nuanced and personal perspectives to the debate. Others again review the history, highlighting continuities and long-term impacts.

Gibbon's contribution included sketchbooks and notebooks drawn undercover in arms fairs, and gifts collected from arms company stalls at these events.
